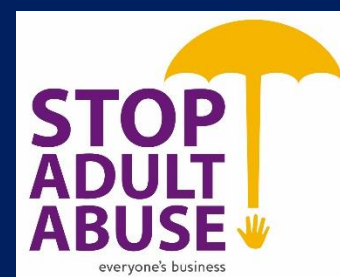


# Cheshire East SAB Newsletter



## Cheshire East Safeguarding Adults Board (CESAB) Update for Information

August 2021

### 1. Domestic Abuse Act 2021

The Domestic Abuse Bill passed both Houses of Parliament and was signed into law in April 2021. The new Act will provide further protection to the millions of people who experience domestic abuse, as well as strengthen measures to tackle perpetrators.

### 2. Complex Safeguarding Group

The newly initiated forum dealing with those individuals residing in Cheshire East with Complex Safeguarding concerns met on the 26<sup>th</sup> May. The Forum which is widely supported through a range of partners including Cheshire East Adults Social Care, Police, Fire, Health, Housing and Substance misuse representatives will consider referrals received which require a multi-agency response to support those at risk of issues relating to self-neglect, hoarding and various types of exploitation.

The forum has scheduled in meetings on a 6 week cycle to the end of 2021 and agencies are encouraged to make referrals for those cases which identify individuals at high risk and require multi-agency involvement. A copy of the referral pathway is available for your information. It is important that existing adult safeguarding pathways are followed as the first port of call. As the group develops, wider input is expected from case workers directly involved with cases referred, and we aim to monitor the impact and learning from these case discussions.

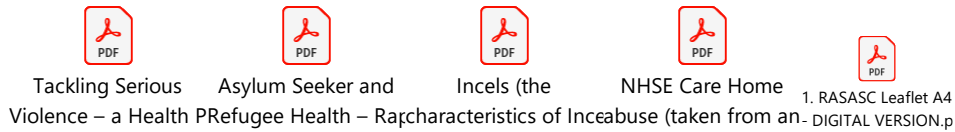

#### 4. LeDeR Programme Annual Report and Update

The national Learning Disabilities Mortality Review (LeDeR) programme was established following evidence from the University of Bristol led Confidential Inquiry into premature deaths of people with learning disabilities (CIPOLD).

The planned end of NHS England’s contract with the University of Bristol in May 2021 provided an opportunity for NHS England to reflect on what has gone well with LeDeR and to identify areas of the programme that need to improve. A newly [revised LeDeR policy](#) was published by NHS England in 2021, incorporating a refreshed review process that will also include reviews of the deaths of people with autism.
